What if my child did NOT take a PARCC assessment?

Students who...

- Did not take ELA 10 will be registered for ELA 10
- Did not take ELA 9 and failed ELA 10 will take ELA 9
- Did not take Algebra 1 will be registered for Algebra 1
- Did not take Geometry and failed Algebra 1 will take Geometry

Will be registered to take the PARCC during the Fall Block PARCC Window detailed below:

DATES:

ELA 9 or 10: **December 11-13**, 2018

Algebra 1 or Geometry: December 17-19, 2018

TIME: After school 2:45-4:45 pm

Class of 2020

Class of 2020 students who did **NOT** take a PARCC assessment results in the need for:

- 220 students to take ELA 10
- 27 students to take ELA 9
- 170 students to take Algebra 1
- 27 students to take Geometry

These students will be registered for PARCC during the Fall Block PARCC Window.

When can students take additional PARCC assessments?

Spring PARCC 2019 (April - May 2019)

- All Juniors will be registered to take PARCC ELA 11 this Spring.
- All Juniors enrolled in Algebra 2 will take PARCC Algebra 2.
- Precalculus, Calculus or AP Math students do NOT take PARCC.
- Students who did not pass PARCC Algebra 1 and Geometry and did NOT take PARCC Algebra 2 last year will take PARCC Algebra 2 in the Spring.

Summer Testing 2019 (July 29 - August 1, 2019)

For students who FAILED OR DID NOT TAKE PARCC ELA 9-11, Algebra 1, Geometry or Algebra 2:

• Summer instruction prior to the test is online module or summer prep class July 1-25, Mondays through Thursdays with July 4 off, 8-12 pm.

How do I find my child's assessment scores?

Parents and students can log on to <u>Genesis</u> and click on the <u>Assessment</u> tab.

- PARCC passing scores are highlighted in green.
- Missing or blank scores are tests that were not taken or received.
- Other test scores listed in Genesis are
 - College entrance tests SAT/ACT, and
 - Preliminary Scholastic Achievement Test (PSAT).

Students who are <u>exempt from passing</u> statewide assessments are only required to take PARCC Algebra 1 and PARCC ELA 10 or DLM.
