BENEFITS: (2018) MAINTAINED ALL OF THE BENEFITS

- Lower cost to parents/families
 - Camps were not charged \$500 for insurance or a 35% administration fee (vendor)
- District insurance covered camps at a minuscule amount
- Five percent of camp revenues were allocated for admin. costs
- Vendor fee of 3.95%/transaction (no \$40 reg. fee)
- Established salary range for camp directors, paraprofessionals, counselors and junior counselors, and prep hours.
- Enrollment increased by 522 campers, representing a 70% increase
- Scholarships for students who qualify for F/R meals
- Tuition free for students who are homeless/displaced
- Established nursing staff coverage for the well-being and safety of all campers

ACTION ITEMS: (2018-19)

- Earlier start:
 - Request for proposals (budgeting) November 2018
 - Initial planning meetings for 2019 camps December 2018
 - Posting of camp information online February 2019
 - Training of staff February 2019
 - Ordering Supplies April/May 2019

PARENT SURVEY RESULTS/FEEDBACK: (2018)

- 208 Parent Surveys
 - 192 rated "very satisfied" regarding the camps/programs
 - 16 rated "satisfied" regarding the camps/programs
 - 0 rated "unsatisfied" regarding the camps/programs
 - 191 rated child attended camp "always or most of the time"
 - 17 rated child attended camp "most of the time"
 - 0 rated child attended camp "never"

PARENT SURVEY RESULTS/FEEDBACK: (2018) (CONTINUED)

- 203 rated staff as "excellent"
- 5 rated staff as "satisfactory"
- 0 rated staff as "unsatisfactory"
- 204 rated camp/programs as a "good value"
- 4 rated camps/programs as "too expensive"

PARENT SURVEY RESULTS: STUDENT CAMPERS & PARENTS FEEDBACK: (2018)

Suggested Changes/Improvements:

- Camps should run until late
 August
- More camps with "extended day" option
- More pool time
- Discounted rate for families with multiple children

Feedback:

- Schools are preparing for September start and need time to clean and prepare the buildings. We can share resources with parents for other community-based summer camps/programs
- Our goal is to provide an extended day option at each school/location
- There is a tight schedule for pool use which is in place to try to accommodate all camps and residents
- We will explore other cost saving factors for families with multiple registrants
